Mewa Singh did his Master's degree at Panjab University, Chandigarh, Ph.D. at University of Mysore and Post Doctoral training in Wildlife Management at Smithsonian Institution Washington DC. He has been a Fulbright Scholar-in-Residence at Bucknell University Pennsylvania; a teaching assistant at the Smithsonian Institution Washington DC; a Visiting Fellow at the Zoological Society of San Diego USA; Visiting Fellow at the German Primate Center Gottingen and Cologne Zoo in Germany; Summer Professor in Germany, visiting Lecturer in Malaysia and a visiting Professor at the Russian Academy of Sciences, Moscow. His research on ecology and behavior of wild mammals, especially of non-human primates, is field based. He has worked in the forests of Himalayas, Western Ghats, Eastern Ghats, and Nicobar Islands. He has published nearly 200 research papers in prestigious Journals in India and outside, and his edited book titled "Macaque Societies: A Model for the study of Social Organization" is published by Cambridge University, England. He is an elected Fellow of the Indian Academy of Sciences Bangalore, Indian National Science Academy New Delhi, The National Academy of Sciences India Allahabad and The National Academy of Psychology, India. He is also a twice recipient of prestigious Ramanna Fellowship by the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India, the J.C. Bose National Fellowship of Govt. of India, and presently, he is SERB Distinguished Fellow. He is also the winner of Sundar Lal Hora Medal in life sciences by the Indian National Science Academy. Recognizing his merit and scholarship in science, the University of Mysore has appointed him as Distinguished Professor (for Life).

He is Chief Editor of a new journal "Dialogue: Science, Scientists and Society" published by the Indian Academy of Sciences, Bangalore.
